PONY CLUB NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP SUCCESS FOR ISLEHAM GIRLS



Two young sisters-Faith & Georgia, who are both in the Littleport and District Pony Club, competed at Chelmondeley Castle, Cheshire, in the Pony Club National Championships in the summer. They competed in the Musical Ride, a synchronised ride involving 10 other ponies and several hours and days of practice. The event was attended by thousands of competitors and spectators. The theme was the Rio Carnival and out of 18 teams they were delighted to come 5th. This was a great achievement and we are extremely proud of their achievement.

P.E. HEALTH & SAFETY- EARRINGS

A great deal of frustration has been caused for some staff and children alike within the last week regarding pupils either being asked to remove earrings, or missing out on P.E. in school because they are wearing them. Obviously, we do not wish children to miss P.E. or swimming classes; however, under Cambridgeshire County Council guidance and for safety reasons the wearing of earrings, ear studs or other jewellery (metal or plastics) is not permitted during sporting activities, PE or swimming. It is for this reason that we ask you to remove your child's earrings for PE days or support them in being able to do this themselves if they are a bit older.

Teachers are advised to prohibit the wearing of earrings, ear studs or other jewellery in all aspects of physical activity or where, on the basis of a risk assessment, there is a risk of injury to the wearer or to others or where there is a risk of standards of hygiene being compromised, such as in Food Technology lessons. Serious injuries have been sustained as a result of contact between pupils wearing jewellery and other pupils, equipment or apparatus especially during physical activity. This is an absolute duty under Health and Safety Regulations and includes rings and wristwatches, and it is for this reason that we ask you to please help your child to remove any earrings before school on days on which they have P.E. or swimming, unless they can quickly and confidently do this independently in school. Members of staff should not be personally involved in the removal and/or temporary secure storage of items of jewellery, both for hygiene and insurance indemnity reasons and to avoid inadvertent injury to the pupil.

In very exceptional circumstances (e.g. newly pierced ear, infection or similar short term medical condition) the ear lobe may be taped temporarily (4 to 6 weeks) with non-allergic (hypo allergenic) microporous tape if it is necessary to retain the stud in place for medical reasons. The school is obliged to adhere to these guidelines, and your support is greatly appreciated.

A CALL TO CHEERLEADING CLUB!







SCHOOL UNIFORM


Thank you once again to all parents who are supporting the school's uniform guidelines and are ensuring their children have the correct uniform items for school.

A few queries answered:-

- Polo shirts and sweatshirt/ cardigans do not need to have the school logo. Of course, if you have purchased smart plain burgundy uniform for your child which does not have the school logo- this is perfectly acceptable.
- All children so though please need a burgundy jumper, sweatshirt, cardigan or fleece. If you do not have a burgundy top for your child, there are many second hand items (which we are willing to give out to you) available in the office, or new items can be purchased from the office.
- Black school shoes are far preferable to trainers for the long school day; however, if you have purchased completely plain black trainers for your child to wear in school this year, these will be permitted.

- ALL items of uniform and all possessions must please be clearly named with permanent marker pen, sew-in tags, iron-on tags or attach-a-tags. We are able to ensure lost items return to their owners very quickly if they are clearly named.
