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AUTUMN MINI REPORTS

The staff will have a mini report to talk through with you at your child's parents' meeting which summarises your child's baseline data since starting back in September, and target areas to support progress. You will receive a copy of the report and any comments and notes from your child's teacher AFTER the meeting.

Each child in Year 1 to 6 has carried out the PIRA (reading) and PUMA (maths) assessments this term relating to the summer term content for maths and reading (as expected of children in the previous year group). E.g. Children in Year 6 have completed summer term Year 5 assessments.

Your child's report shows their standardised score in this assessment.

PIRA & PUMA statistical analysis is based on large numbers of children nationally taking the PIRA & PUMA tests, and then looking at what these children went on to achieve in national tests such as SATs.

Their analysis demonstrate that children achieving 94-114 tend to go on to achieve the expected standard in national tests; children with scores of 115 and above stand a greater chance of achieving the 'greater depth' standard in national tests.

If your child is currently not working at their expected level (94 or above), please use the next set of pupil targets provided on your child's report as a guide to the priority areas in which to support them in the second half of this term.

If your child has special educational needs and is on the SEND register, the staff will go through your child's Assess Plan Do Review (APDR) targets during the parents' consultation meeting too.
