Nut free school

Please can I remind everyone, that we are a nut free school. This year we have been joined by several children who have several allergies when in contact with nuts and nut products, which also include sesame.

Children who suffer from nut allergies can develop a severe, potentially life-threatening allergic reaction.

If someone has a nut allergy it is not just eating nuts that can cause a severe reaction, just being touched on the skin or smelling the breath of someone who has had nuts or a product containing nuts can trigger anaphylactic shock (which can cause breathing and swallowing difficulties).

We cannot have nuts in school in any form.

The school kitchen does not have any of these products or ingredients, so please be careful with the provision of a packed lunch. NO to any of the following products!

- Peanuts or other nuts
- Peanut butter
- Hazelnut (chocolate) spread
- Products with Sesame Seeds
- Cereal bars containing nuts
- Granola bars containing nuts
- Biscuits/cookies that contain nuts
- Some Asian food (satay)

This list is not exhaustive, so please check the packaging of products closely.
