Background:

In April 2013, the Government announced new funding of £150 million for Physical Education (PE) and sport. This funding should be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision. It has recently been announced that the primary PE and sport premium funding will continue from 2017 to 2018. This funding is ring fenced to be used for sport specific areas to make an impact in Physical Education and Sport in schools.

Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and Sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

During the academic year September 2017 to July 2018 we plan to spend our funding in the following areas:

- Core Sports Package purchased from Witchford School Sports Partnership*
- Specialist sports instructors from Premier Sport
- Update and extend variety of PE equipment offered to pupils
- Purchase 'Maths of the Day'
- Additional transport costs
