CORONAVIRUS ADVICE FOR FAMILIES

Dear Parents.

I am writing to you following the national update to COVID-19 advice issued last week. The Chief Medical Officer provided new advice at the end of last week around self-isolation and Public Health England have updated their web pages so we would encourage you to review the updated information online: https://www.gov.uk/guidance/coronavirus-covid-19-information-for-the-public

You must self-isolate at home for seven days if you have a recent onset of:

- High temperature and/or
- A new continuous cough

If staff or pupils have these symptoms, then they should now take steps to stay at home and not leave their house for seven days from when their symptoms started.

This will help to protect others in the community while they are infectious. Anyone displaying symptoms should not come to school, go to a GP surgery, pharmacy or hospital. Please report absence in the normal way by calling the school office.

If you keep your child at home, you do not need to contact NHS 111 to tell them they are staying at home and Public Health England will not be testing people who are self-isolating with mild symptoms. If your child's symptoms worsen during home isolation or are no better after 7 days, please contact NHS 111 Online at 111.nhs.uk.

If your child is in school and it becomes evident that they have a continuous cough and/or a high temperature, we will contact you immediately and ask for your child to be collected. We will do this not only for the health and wellbeing of your child, but also for the health and wellbeing of the school community.

Please be aware that we cannot reply to individual phone calls regarding this situation. We are receiving daily advice from the Department of Education and Public Health England. We will continue to respond and act accordingly and keep everyone updated via our school communications. The government has not changed its advice regarding domestic trips. However, the school has carried out a comprehensive risk assessment and taken the decision not to go ahead with trips, sporting fixtures and community events until further notice.

We are taking a number of measures to ensure the safety of children, staff and visitors in school. These include additional handwashing and cleaning routines, teaching of effective handwashing to children, provision of an isolation room, consideration of vulnerable children and adults with medical conditions, reducing contact situations (assemblies, carpet time and events outside the school community). We will also be restricting use of some high contact resources such as iPads and increasing cleaning of these items.

We will continue to provide regular updates regarding this situation by email and concerned parents should visit the NHS coronavirus webpage https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/ in the first instance or phone NHS 111 and seek professional health advice.

We will only close the school if advised by Public Health England that we should do so or if the Government announces blanket closures. However insufficient staffing levels due to illness may also necessitate closure. This may happen at short notice, but we will of course contact you as quickly as possible if this will be necessary.

Meanwhile, if you should find that your family are required to self-isolate or you or your child are diagnosed with Coronavirus, a link to some home learning packs for the weeks of the 16.3.2020, 23.3.2020 and 30.3.2020 can be found on our website. Your child can download and complete the work within the packs if he or she is unable to attend school but well enough to continue with home learning. We are also running a poster challenge- children are being asked to create an information poster about an inspirational person for display in the school (A3 size is ideal).

Please return any completed work to your child's class teacher when he or she returns to school. Don't forget that Key Stage 2 children can also log on to **TTRockstars** and **spag.com** with their online subscriptions, and children should aim to continue reading and practising their year group spellings (these are included in the front of your child's home school book).

We understand how challenging and worrying the current situation is and thank you for your patience and support during this difficult period.
