## **ROUTINES & PROTOCOLS FOR SEPTEMBER'S RE-OPENING**

We will be sending out more detailed guidance in the summer holidays prior to the return to school in September, but for now, please see last week's newsletter for guidance so far... children will be returning to school on the 7<sup>th</sup> September (or the 8<sup>th</sup> September for new intake Reception children).



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### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT RE-OPENING

Can children wear leggings for school? Leggings will NOT be permitted as school uniform. Children should please have grey school trousers, pinafore dress or skirt to wear with their school uniform plain black shoes and burgundy sweatshirt/ cardigan

Black leggings or jogging bottoms CAN be worn however JUST on PE days with trainers. Whilst we are happy for children to wear up any trainers which fit in the autumn term for PE, please try to avoid brightly coloured and patterned trainers for school as these become a fashion-statement rather than sportswear.

**How will lunches be kept cool?** Any packed lunches provided by parents will be stored at room temperature. If you are worried about any items keeping cool on hot days, please add a frozen ice bag to keep items cool or refrigerate the full lunch bag before bringing it in. The whole lunch bag needs to disposable at the end of each lunchtime.

Can parents come into the office reception area? Unfortunately not- we do need to reduce the number of people accessing the school building. If any parents have enquiries, they are asked to please email these through to the office@isleham.cambs.sch.uk email address or post any paperwork into the letterbox. Due to the exit arrangements, it will also not be possible for children to go back into school at the end of the day if they have forgotten things. They will have their own space in each classroom, and will need to ensure they pick up their coat, water bottle and book bag when it is time to go home. Similarly, in the mornings, if your child forgets an item of clothing, a water bottle or book bag, this will need to be left at home for the day and we will manage without items being dropped off late to the office.

Will my child be provided with a reading book and home-school diary? From September, we will be sending home books each day for your child to read. However, we have decided NOT to purchase home school diaries as ClassDojo will be used as an online reading log. Children will need to bring their reading book to school each day and it will be swopped for a new book if required. Older pupils who no longer wish to use a book bag or who have lost their school book bag WILL NOT be permitted to bring a rucksack instead. Parents are asked to please provide a plastic folder or sleeve which will keep the book flat and protected, similar to those below. Alternatively, spare school book bags are available in the office at a cost of £4.50.



**Can my child bring a snack to school?** Children may bring a small piece of fruit or vegetable to eat at school at midmorning snacktime. This should be included in their book bag or lunch bag in a disposable wrapper if needed- no non-disposable plastic pots please. Key Stage 1 children will have fruit provided from the national KS1 fruit scheme so need not bring additional snack from home unless desired.

We are expecting all children to be returning to school <u>from Monday 7<sup>th</sup> September 2020 unless they are required</u> <u>to be medically shielded</u>. Please see the link below to the latest guidance which we will be working to. Final updates will be provided on 17<sup>th</sup> August, so we will send through final confirmation of arrangements after this point.
