NEXT WEEK: THE RETURN TO SCHOOL FOR ALL PUPILS FROM 8.3.21

I am sure you have all been following the news to establish the nation's 'road map' out of Covid-19 and the much-anticipated wider re-opening of schools. I and the school team have been working hard to put all the necessary measures in place for all pupils to return to school safely from the 8th March 2021. I appreciate this may be a source of concern for some of you, but please be assured, 'wider reopening' does not mean a return to 'normal'. We will continue to remain vigilant and maintain & adapt the various protocols we have developed since September 2020 to ensure the safety of our school users.

With recorded incidents of Covid in the community well below national figures, we are confident the chance of infection is falling too, however this is not the time to take unnecessary risks. The Government has published a detailed 'road map' outlining the country's route out of Covid restrictions, but the emphasis upon social distancing, minimal social contact between households and essential travel only, remain clear.

Our Covid Risk Assessment has not been diluted in anyway and it is very much our intention to continue implementing strong safeguarding measures to reduce the risk of infection in and around the school. This means the following arrangements instigated before Christmas will continue:



- Further staggered times for the beginning and end of the school day which will continue with the one-way system, allowing for social distancing of adults during the collection and drop-off of pupils
- Pupils will remain in class-specific bubbles with contact between adjacent classes kept to a minimum and no direct contact with other year groups across the school
- All classroom-based staff will be allocated a class bubble and their movement between classes will be avoided as much as possible.
- Children will continue to eat their meals in their respective classrooms (or in the hall/ group room for Reception and Year 1 children) separate to other classes
- Assemblies and Collective Worship will continue to be conducted via Zoom/ video link
- School protocol regarding suspected and confirmed cases of Covid remain the same with parents encouraged to keep children off school if they are poorly. Children in school displaying symptoms will be isolated immediately and parents instructed to collect as soon as possible.
- Contact tracing procedures remain in the event of a confirmed case.

In addition to this, the following procedures have been instigated since January:

- All staff will continue to undertake two Lateral Flow Tests each week.
- Staff and pupils classified as Clinically Extremely Vulnerable will continue to shield until at least 31st March

Whilst the school is reopening to all pupils, with its breakfast club and after-school childcare provision in place from 7.45am daily and up until 5.15pm (latest pick-up) daily, there are some aspects of our provision we are unable to provide immediately. This includes: all after school sports clubs this term, and swimming (which will not resume until the Summer Term at the earliest and will be subject to Government Guidance and our own Risk Assessment Protocol). Rest assured, these will resume as soon as it is deemed safe to do so. I appreciate the reduced numbers of pupils accessing the school during this lockdown has enabled parents to see space in the staff car park at the beginning and end of the day; however, we must please ask that no vehicles attempt to turn into the staff car park in future other than staff vehicles, as our main pedestrian exit is via the vehicular access gates, and this is a busy thoroughfare. Do please continue to make sure alternative arrangements are made to avoid compromising punctuality e.g. park in The Beeches car park.

An information leaflet about re-opening is now available on ClassDojo and via our school website; please make sure you read through this leaflet to keep abreast of developments and the systems and procedures in place. Please be aware attendance for statutory school age children will once again be compulsory from 8th March 2021. We look forward to welcoming your children again to school very soon.
