

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<u>Class dojo</u>

In the recent parent survey and also during discussions with the governing body, it has been decided to lessen the number of classdojo entries. You may have noticed that the class teachers are sending briefer messages on the main page and keeping to just one lot of photographs per week. This is to ensure that the system is not overloaded with a huge number of entries.

We are also attempting to use the events option to remind of activities and the website contains the main details of the term of learning, so please do look there for more details of the curriculum.

Reading

We are aware that reading is causing some frustration in school, in the lower year groups. While phonic books have been used it the past to build reading skills at home, we now rely on technology to provide reading material. This is due partly to the Little Wandle scheme that we use for phonics but also due to the fact that we have just 6 copies of each of the books that are used. The children move on quickly through the scheme and you only need one book to be forgotten, and then there is not enough for the next group of children.



Please remember that we are teaching the children to read their phonic book, three times per week in class, with adults in each group. This is far more opportunity to read with a skilled practitioner, then we had in the past. What we would really like you to do at home, is read the phonic book on a technology device, as homework, and then enjoy books from the library area at bedtime or relaxing time. This will increase the love of books and stories.
