FAMOUS AUTHOR VISIT- WEDNESDAY THIS WEEK

A famous children's author- James Campbell- is coming to our school this week on Wednesday 11th March 2020. He is an author, storyteller and a comedian. James' books are available in all the usual bookshops and online places but he is going to bring a box of them with him so they can be sold after school. He is very happy to sign and dedicate them to your child. Hopefully this will help cement the experience of meeting a real author and inspire our children to write for themselves.

James' latest series of books are called **The Funny Life...** and are published by Bloomsbury. The first book is **The Funny Life of Pets** and is published by Bloomsbury. This is a hilarious look at the world of pets that everyone from Y2 to Y6 will love. It's particularly good for reluctant readers. This book costs £7.

The latest book is called **The Funny Life of Teachers**. This is also for Y2 to Y6 and is rib-ticklingly funny for anyone who has ever been to school. This book is also ± 7 .

James' four **Boyface** books are published by Hodder Children's Books. These are quirky and imaginative stories about a boy learning to find his place in a world of magical machines and unusual zebras. The titles are: **Boyface and the Quantum Chromatic Disruption Machine**, **Boyface and the Tartan Badger**, **Boyface and the Uncertain Ponies** and **Boyface and the Power of Three And A Bit**

The Boyface books cost £6 each and are aimed at Y2, Y3, Y4, Y5 and Y6. However, Y1 and Reception can enjoy them with a bit of help.

There is also an audio book available which is aimed squarely at Reception, Y1 and Y2. This is called **The Wimpety Wam and Other True Stories,** is a book to listen to on CD and includes The Umbrella Tree which James usually performs as part of his time with the younger children. This CD costs £7.

ASSEMBLIES THIS WEEK






This week, our Monday assembly will focus on 'sacrifices' and things we have given up, or changes we can make for Lent.

Preventing spread of infection

We are aware that the best way to prevent infection is to avoid being exposed to the virus. There are general principles anyone can follow to help prevent the spread of respiratory viruses, including:

*washing your hands often – with soap and water, or using alcohol sanitiser if handwashing facilities are not available. This is particularly important after taking public transport

*covering your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throwing the tissue in a bin. See Catch it, Bin it, Kill it

*people who feel unwell should stay at home and should not attend work or any education or childcare setting

We will continue to encourage pupils, staff and visitors to wash their hands regularly and thoroughly in school. According to the NHS, you should **wash your hands for at least 20 seconds**, or as long as it takes you to sing "**Happy Birthday**" **twice**. People are encouraged to **wet their hands with water before applying enough soap** to cover their hands and rubbing them together. <u>Please also encourage your children to do the same at home</u>.

We have sourced some really lovely items for the stalls this year so I'm sure your children will find a perfect gift for you. Thanks for your support, the PTA.






