




WORLD BOOK DAY 2020

JAMES CAMPBELL AUTHOR VISIT NEXT WEEK

A famous children's author- James Campbell- is coming to our school next week on Wednesday 11th March 2020. He is an author, storyteller and a comedian.



James' books are available in all the usual bookshops and online places but he is going to bring a box of them with him so they can be sold after school. He is very happy to sign and dedicate them to your child. Hopefully this will help cement the experience of meeting a real author and inspire our children to write for themselves.

James' latest series of books are called **The Funny Life...** and are published by Bloomsbury. The first book is **The Funny Life of Pets** and is published by Bloomsbury. This is a hilarious look at the world of pets that everyone from Y2 to Y6 will love. It's particularly good for reluctant readers. This book costs £7.

The latest book is called **The Funny Life of Teachers**. This is also for Y2 to Y6 and is rib-ticklingly funny for anyone who has ever been to school. This book is also £7.

James' four **Boyface** books are published by Hodder Children's Books. These are quirky and imaginative stories about a boy learning to find his place in a world of magical machines and unusual zebras. The titles are:

Boyface and the Quantum Chromatic Disruption Machine Boyface and the Tartan Badger Boyface and the Uncertain Ponies Boyface and the Power of Three And A Bit

The Boyface books cost £6 each and are aimed at Y2, Y3, Y4, Y5 and Y6, however, Y1 and Reception can enjoy them with a bit of help.







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SCIENCE WEEK 2020



You might be aware that it will soon be National Science Week, where children are encouraged to embrace science activities. This year the whole of Isleham School will be enjoying a variety of science lessons over 2 or more days during the week beginning the 9th March 2020. They will even have a scientist visit for the assembly on Thursday 12th March!

One of the activities will be to visit Suzie's wood for a session led by Mrs Deacon based on the learning of the class, but in a different, woodland setting. They will be finding minibeasts, making models, exploring using the senses and looking for signs of living things, to name but a few items for the sessions.

You will have already received a consent form to attend the woods, so please make sure it has been returned to school, if you have not already done so. Below is the timetable for each class to attend the wood. If the class are going in the morning then please send them to school in their woodland clothing, with school uniform in a bag to change into. However, Year 6 are attending in the afternoon so they need to arrive at school in uniform and have their kit ready in a bag so they can change to go after lunch.

Please remember to use clothing that is warm, waterproof and can get muddy. Also footwear should be sturdy and waterproof. (Wellies or old sturdy trainers are fine)


