SAMARITAN'S PURSE OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD SHOEBOX APPEAL- DEADLINE THIS WEEK



Once again Pound Lane Free Church in Isleham is acting as a regional drop-off and sorting centre for Operation Christmas Child shoebox gifts. The project aims to offer a Christmas gift box to some of the most needy children around the world, who without this scheme would not have any gifts at Christmas time. A leaflet was sent home with your children before Half term detailing the suggested gifts which could be included in the shoebox and the monetary donation required to cover shipping costs and processing costs.

School families are welcome to fill their own box, and bring this along to school for collection by Friday 9th November, or help to fill one of the two class boxes in each room.

Each of the class boxes will need:-

Toys

Include items that children will immediately embrace such as dolls or stuffed toys (with CE label), toy trucks, harmonica, yo-yo, skipping rope, ball, small puzzles etc.

School Supplies

Pens, pencils & sharpeners, crayons or felt pens, stamps & ink pad sets, writing pads or notebooks & paper, solar calculators, colouring & picture books etc.



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Toothbrush, bars of wrapped soap, comb or hairbrush, flannel.

Hat, cap, gloves or scarf, sunglasses, hair accessories, jewellery set, wind up torch




