THE SCHOOL YEAR 2018-19



Welcome to the 2018-19 school year at Isleham Primary. The staff are looking forward to working with your children this year, and to welcoming the new Reception pupils later this week, who will also be meeting their Year 6 buddies on Friday.

We hope you have enjoyed a wonderful summer break. Just a few quick messages for the first week back:-

- Year 1 to 6 children will no longer be lining up in the playground at the start of the school day, as we would like to make a more prompt start to lessons by enabling children to filter into school from 8.50am ready for a prompt start at 9.00am. Please ensure your child is in the playground by 8.55am at the very latest so that he or she can come straight through the gates to the classroom. (If you need to speak to the teacher, please wait until the end of the day or send a note or message via your child or the office for the teacher to call you at breaktime).
- At collection time from today, <u>Year 1 and Year R can be collected from the Reception playground</u> (Year R from their classrooms door and Year 1 from the group room door) to help ease the congestion near the Year 2 classroom/ pond area. <u>Please can all parents and carers collect children</u> promptly and move away from the doorways once their child is safely with them. There were many families remaining on site a long time after collection in the summer months, with parents allowing school children and younger siblings to play with school equipment, climb on the triangular 'quiet space' hut and tables, swing on the disabled ramp bars, and to play on the field and climbing frame at the end of the school day. Please note that all children should be leaving the site promptly after collection, and the school site cannot be made available for families after the close of the school day as we need to ensure all gates are locked and the site is safely secured. Staff are often in meetings or have additional duties at the end of the school day, and cannot be expected to be



collecting additional litter, supervising children, opening doors for toilet access and dealing with injuries when families and children should have left the site. The Beeches Community centre is available for children who wish to play and families who wish to chat. Thank you for your co-operation.

- Your child's class teacher will be sending home <u>a class newsletter on Friday this week</u>. Please do not hesitate to speak to the class teacher at the end of the school day or to send a note if you have any queries or concerns.
- We will aim to publish the whole school newsletter to the website by 11am each Monday morning. Please read the newsletter regularly and let me know if there is anything you would like added in, such as news of your child's achievements outside school (e.g. an award gained at an outside club or event.) ATTENDANCE EXPECTATIONS

Just a quick reminder to all parents that the school expects 100% attendance from all children, except in the case of extreme illness or injury. If your child is very unwell and cannot manage a day at school, please let the office know on 01638 780336. Your child needs to see a GP if absence exceeds 3 days or if more and may require a medical plan to be drawn up if he or she is frequently missing school due to illness.

In return, we will aim to only send children home if they are not coping in school due to illness or have a contagious illness or suspected illness which a GP need to verify.

We wish to enable children to be in school if at all possible, and staff are trained to administer medicine if needed during the school day. Please note though that GPs confirm that '3 times a day' medicines can be taken before school, after school and at bedtime, so as to avoid them needing to be taken in school. Please ensure '4 times a day' medicines or specific medicines for your child are provided in the original named container along with a signed medicine form.

Please note that term-time absence for holidays cannot be authorised under our policy, and holiday absence of over 3 days will be most likely to incur a penalty notice fee.

SUMMER CELEBRATIONS & AWARDS

Very many congratulations to all of the children who received awards at the end of last term for their hard work, good effort, excellent attendance and achievement in the school year 2017-18. We look forward to presenting numerous awards this year as the children begin work in their new classes.

MENU THIS WEEK

From September 2018, the Lunchtime Company will be serving the lunchtime meals to the pupils at Isleham C of E Primary School in place of CCS who cease trading in December 2018.



The Lunchtime Company is run by award-winning Master Chefs who will provide training and support to our existing kitchen staff Mrs King and Mrs Marsh.

All meals will continue to be cooked from fresh ingredients every day, sourced locally (where possible within a 60 mile radius of the school) and prepared on-site.

Over the course of the academic year there will be various theme days, activities, cookery classes and charity events – these will be advertised around the school and in the newsletter. The Lunchtime Company want to help children gain a real appreciation for good quality food, where it comes from, how it is produced and why healthy food is important.

A parent information leaflet about the Lunchtime Company is available from our school website. Don't forget that meals are completely free for children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2, and just £2.40 each for children in Key Stage 2 (with some children entitled to free school meals)- please ask in the office if you are unsure if your child is entitled to free meal.

The Lunchtime Company will be offering a birthday table scheme as the school has previously offered under CCS- if your child is celebrating his or her birthday, he or she can book a table for their special day via the school office. The birthday table for Key Stage 1 and Reception children is completely free for up to 6 children. At Key Stage 2, parents can pay for 6 children to enjoy the birthday table. Cakes are provided for the birthday child and for all birthday table guests.
